Last week our Years 7 and 8 students attended an Orthodoxy Excursion to the Parish of The Presentation of Our Lord in Coburg. Our College Chaplain, Reverend Father Leonidas Ioannou, provided our students with an extensive tour and presentation of the Parish, enlightening our students on various aspects of the Orthodox Christian Faith.

From our arrival, our students were immersed in a discussion about the architecture of the church building and how one conducts themselves upon entering the church. It was followed by an intensive discussion of the iconography displayed on the church walls, including the stories and themes presented in the icons. Reverand Father Leonidas focussed on the way Panagia is represented in various icons to our students.

The students viewed liturgical items that are used in the services of our Church and their meaning and symbolism. The vestments worn by the clergy were also presented individually and explained in detail.

It was truly an engaging hands-on experience for our students learning about our Orthodox Christian faith. We thank Reverend Father Leonidas Ioannou for providing our students with such a fruitful, enriching and rewarding presentation.
