From the Principal

Principal's Reflection at the Commencement Assembly

There is much in the world around us that God has created for us to take inspiration from - take Geese.

We see them overhead – But have you ever wondered why they fly in a V like they do? Geese in flight form a V or plump. They fly in formation to conserve energy, communicate and remain together. But why?

Energy conservation

To conserve energy on migrations some of which are 4,000kms in length, Geese fly slightly above the bird in front of them which reduces wind resistance – this 'uplift effect' scientists estimate can save around 70% of flight energy expenditure. Faster, quicker, safer, less energy used!

Communication and co-ordination

Geese use honking patterns to encourage and co-ordinate their movements - keeping better track of each other, heightening morale and permitting them to 'doze' when flying, allowing them to remain only partially alert at 7000m, or higher if you like than Mt Everest.

Visual assurance

The V formation makes it easy for geese to keep track of each other.

The plumb rotates leadership of the V as they tire. This form of shared effort and leadership ensures the load and responsibility is shared especially on long trips by the entire group.

Interestingly, when a goose gets sick or wounded, two other geese drop out of the formation and then follow it down to help and protect it. They remain with the goose for as long as it takes, until it dies or is able to fly again. They then assist with the 'catch up task' in re-joining the plump. Remarkable!

If we have any sense at all, we would do well to emulate them. Our classrooms are more productive, our learning is heightened, teams more successful.

Put simply, by looking out and after each other, we are more likely to get where we need to go and in better shape. A great way to conduct ourselves and our activities in 2025!

Next time you see a flock of birds in formation, I hope you will remember this life lesson they are sharing with us each and every day!


